

Buddhist Ceremony for Safety Held for Nakakyuyshu Onitayama 2 Wind Farm Site

Japan Renewable Energy Corporation ("JRE"; headquartered in Minato-ku, Tokyo; Kazuhiro Takeuchi, CEO) today announced that a Buddhist ceremony for safety was held for the Nakakyushu Onitayama 2 Wind Farm, currently under construction at Gokase town and Morotsuka village in Miyazaki Prefecture. Representatives of the operating and construction companies involved in the project attended the ceremony, which was held at Josenji Temple in Gokase town.

The facility under construction lies adjacent to the Nakakyushu Onitayama Wind Farm, which Miyazaki Prefecture has included in its Next Generation Energy Park scheme. Once the new facility begins operation, it will also be available as a venue for various eco-learning activities in the local community.

JRE will continue to operate its power plants in a community-friendly manner with the support of local residents and work to help advance the use of renewable energy.
