ENEOS Renewable Energy Signs Separate Comprehensive Partnership Agreements with Ninohe City, Kunohe Village, and Ichinohe Town to Promote Community Development and Enhanced Public Services

ENEOS Renewable Energy Corporation (headquarters: Minato Ward, Tokyo; President, CEO, and Representative Director: Kazuhiro Takeuchi; hereinafter “ERE”) signed separate comprehensive partnership agreements on April 13, 2025 with three Iwate Prefecture municipalities: Ninohe City (Mayor: Jun Fujiwara), Kunohe Village (Mayor: Katsuhiko Okubo), and Ichinohe Town (Mayor: Yoshinori Onodera). The aim of the partnerships is to promote community development and enhance public services.

A joint signing ceremony with the three municipalities was held at the Ichinohe Community Center in an open format, welcoming participation from local residents. The lively event featured various attractions presented by the municipalities and ERE, including appearances by local mascot characters* and ENEOS’s official mascot Enegori-kun. The event was designed both to offer enjoyment to local residents and to serve as an opportunity to reflect together on the future of the region.

Up to now, the three municipalities have accepted ERE’s JRE Oritsumedake South 1 Wind Farm. In addition to constructing and operating the facility, ERE has also supported local residents by donating notebooks featuring educational content for elementary students and establishing a scholarship fund for high school students. With these agreements, ERE and the three municipalities are taking a new step toward strengthening their collaboration to address local challenges and advance sustainable development of society through renewable energy and other initiatives.
